VI. <u>BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT</u>

The Demarest School District performed well above state average and strategies are being developed to further help those on the lower end of the scoring.

It was moved by Choi, seconded by Verna and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve provisional employment of Jacqueline Venuti, leave replacement, MA, Step 1, effective May 1, 2020 through the end of the 2019/2020 school year, PCR 2210-040-200-00001, budget code 11-000-219-104-000-00-31 as recommended by the Chief School Administrator. Employment status would become effective upon candidate's compliance with P.L. 1986, c.116 (revised 6/30/98) and N.J.S.A. 18A:6-7.7.

D. Support Services – Board of Education

- 1. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve proposal from EI Associates, district architect of record, to provide professional architectural and engineering services for the County Road School Addition at a cost not to exceed \$260,300.00 plus related project reimbursable expenses. This contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a "professional service" by a firm authorized to perform such services, under the provision of the Public School Contract law, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator.
- 2. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve the following resolution, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator:

Opposing Delay in Transmission of Quarterly Property Tax Revenue to School Districts

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 3902, currently pending in the State Legislature, would authorize the Department of Community Affairs to permit municipalities to delay the quarterly transmission of property tax revenues to school districts during gubernatorial-declared emergencies; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's public schools are highly dependent on property tax revenue to support education programs; and

WHEREAS, on average, local property taxes constitute close to 60% of public school revenue, with the percentage even greater in a significant number of districts; and WHEREAS, a delay in payments from municipalities would result in a financial crisis for school districts, seriously disrupting the educational process—and bringing it to a halt; and WHEREAS, although public school buildings are closed during the current health emergency, the education of our students is taking place through remote learning and home instruction; and

WHEREAS, continued timely transmission of school property taxes is critical for the education process to continue without interruption; and

WHEREAS, even though municipalities are designated as the authorities to collect property taxes, these taxes are levied for specific purposes—e.g., municipal, school, county, fire district—and these obligations must continue to be met; and

WHEREAS, as currently written, A-3902, which is intended to ease a financial burden on municipalities, would place a severe strain on school districts and the students and families that they serve; and

WHEREAS, the Demarest Board of Education recognizes the impact of the current public health emergency on the state and local governments, as well as local school districts, but believes this legislation would worsen the situation for our communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Demarest Board of Education urges the State Senate and the Governor to oppose A-3902; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution be delivered to Governor Phil Murphy, State Senate President Stephen M. Sweeney, Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin; and the 39th Legislative District's representatives in the state Senate and General Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the New Jersey School Boards Association.

3. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve the following resolution, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator:

WHEREAS, the Demarest Board of Education previously adopted a Code Section 125 plan; a Code Section 105 Health Flexible Spending Account ("Health FSA") and a Code Section 129 Dependent Care Spending Account ("Dependent Care FSA"), collectively referred to as the Cafeteria Plan (the "Plan"); and

WHEREAS, with the CARES ACT (COVID-3 Stimulus Bill), which permits employers to amend the Plan to allow Over the Counter (OTC) medicines as eligible for reimbursement without the a prescription/letter of necessity for the Health FSA; and

WHEREAS, effective 1/1/20 the Demarest Board of Education desires to amend the Plan as set forth in the attached amendment and Summary of Material of Modifications to permit OTC) medicines as eligible for reimbursement without the a prescription consistent with the requirements set forth in (COVID-3 Stimulus Bill); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Demarest Board of Education has hereby reviewed the attached amendment and Summary of Material Modifications and does hereby approve the adoption as set forth therein; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Demarest Board of Education are hereby authorized to take the steps necessary to execute this amendment.

- 4. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve donation of certain district cafeteria foods prior to their expiration date(s) in conjunction with Demarest Mayor's office and the Demarest Borough Council, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator.
- 5. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve the donation of iPad(s) no longer in service to the district, to the Bergen County Prosecutors Office, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator.
- 6. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve the donation of iPad(s) no longer in service to the district, to the Bergen County Health Care Center, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator.

7. It was moved by Lee, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present, with Cantatore abstaining, to approve waiving of May tuition charges for Demarest Early Learners, as recommended by the Chief School Administrator.

- 4. It was moved by Schliem, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve March 2020 in office checks in the amount of \$426,245.18 and April 28, 2020 budget checks in the amount of \$140,792.81 as follows:
