## VII. CORRESPONDENCE

- A. Board Secretary Kelly reviewed this month's correspondence.
  - Resident letter regarding noise from snow blower and garbage removal was discussed.

## VIII. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

A. Board President Holzberg discussed the 2021/2022 proposed preliminary budget and thanked Ms. Kelly for her work to prepare the budget.

## IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- A Superintendent Fox commented on the following:
  - The students and families had fun with the snow sculpture contest. There were 115 entries and strong feedback. The PTO was terrific.
  - Demarest recreation camp program to use facilities during summer
  - Vikings request for facility use will be discussed at the next work session.
  - District Goal update: Re-opening of school/Virtual platform
     In September we opened school five days a week at half days each day for all students and provided virtual Wildcat office hours in the afternoon.

Starting in January we launched our Academic Enrichment sessions in the afternoons. These remote sessions included but are not limited to: Mastering Middle School for 5<sup>th</sup> grade, Basic Business and Finance for 6<sup>th</sup> grade, and Spanish Instruction for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades.

## X. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

A. The Budget Committee report – Ms. Verna, the chair of the budget committee reviewed the highlights of the 2021/2022 preliminary budget. Ms. Verna stated that the proposed 2021/2022 budget includes a 2% tax levy increase. The appropriations include funds for the County Road School addition, a new staff position, and for the summer enrichment program. The anticipated revenues will include \$1,000,000 in capital reserve funds to offset the cost of the County Road School addition. Currently the revenues do not include an increase in state aid. We will have to wait until after the Governor's budget address on February 23, 2021 to determine a state aid funding.

## XI. PUBLIC HEARING ON LEASE PURCHASE

A. Public Hearing to discuss financing for the lease purchase agreement for the County Road School addition. Ms. Lisa Gorab of Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer was unable to attend the meeting, however, Ms. Kelly presented the information for the public hearing.

B. Ms. Kelly stated that the estimated cost of the County Road School addition is \$4,110,000. We are anticipating financing \$3,110,000 through the lease purchase and the remaining \$1,000,000 will be funded with capital reserve funds. We are planning on advertising for proposals in the next few weeks. The lease will be over five years and the interest and principal payments will be paid directly from the budget.

There were no questions from the public as there were no members of the public in attendance.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF DEMAREST IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING CERTAIN ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH A LEASE PURCHASE TRANSACTION

February 9, 2021

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the Borough of Demarest in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Board" when referring to the governing body and the "School District" when referring to the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) has determined to undertake: (a) a capital improvement project pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:20-17, consisting of the construction and equipping of an addition at the County Road School for an estimated cost of \$4,110,000 and (b) the \$450,000 potential refinance of the balance of the outstanding lease purchase dated August 15, 2018 in order to produce interest savings in light of reduced tax-exempt interest rates (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to finance all or a portion of the Project pursuant to a lease purchase agreement as permitted by N.J.S.A. 18A:20-4.2(f) (the "Lease Purchase") in an amount not to exceed \$4,560,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:26-10.3, the Board is required to conduct a public hearing on the Project and the proposed Lease Purchase; and

**WHEREAS,** notice of such public hearing was advertised on January 26, 2021 in <u>The Record</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Board has conducted such public hearing on the date hereof; and WHEREAS, the Board now seeks to take certain steps to authorize such Lease Purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF DEMAREST IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (by the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the full membership of the Board), as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board hereby endorses the financing all or a portion of the Project through a lease purchase financing and approves a maximum funding level of \$4,560,000 for the Lease Purchase.

**Section 2.** Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Bond Counsel and Phoenix Advisors, Municipal Advisor are hereby authorized to advertise for proposals for the selection of a lessor for the Lease Purchase

**Section 3.** Wilentz, Goldman & Spitzer, P.A., Bond Counsel and Phoenix Advisors, Municipal Advisor are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and submit an application to the New Jersey Department of Education ("NJDOE") to obtain approval of the Lease Purchase.

Section 4. Upon receipt of NJDOE approval, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, is authorized to award the Lease Purchase to the lessor which proposed the most economically advantageous proposal to the Board. The term of the Lease shall not exceed five (5) years. In consultation with Bond Counsel, the Board President, the Board Vice President, the Superintendent and the Business Administrator/Board Secretary are each hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents including, but not limited to, a lease purchase agreement, a ground lease, if required, an escrow agreement, as applicable, and all closing documents in connection with the Lease Purchase and are hereby authorized to take any other action necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

**Section 5.** To the best of its knowledge, the Board hereby confirms that the annual lease payments and any operating expenses related to the agreement can be included within the School District's net budget spending growth limitations and will not result in the need for approval by the voters of additional spending proposals to maintain existing instructional programs or extracurricular activities.

**Section 6.** The Board hereby covenants that it will comply with any conditions subsequently imposed by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), in order to preserve the exemption from taxation of interest on the Lease, including, if necessary, the requirement to rebate all net investment earnings on the gross proceeds above the yield on the Lease Purchase.

**Section 7.** The Lease will be designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" for purposes of section 265(b) (3) (B) (ii) of the Code.

Section 8. The Board reasonably expects to reimburse its expenditure of Project costs paid prior to the issuance of the Lease with proceeds of the Lease. This resolution is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the Board's official intent to reimburse the expenditure of ESP Costs paid prior to the issuance of the Lease with the proceeds of the Lease, in accordance with Treasury Regulations §150-2. The maximum principal amount of the Lease expected to be issued to finance the Project is \$4,560,000. The Project costs to be reimbursed with the proceeds of the Lease will be "capital expenditures" in accordance with the meaning of Section 150 of the Code. No reimbursement allocation will employ an "abusive arbitrage device" under Treasury Regulations §1.148-10 to avoid the arbitrage restrictions or to avoid the restrictions under Sections 142 through 147, inclusive, of the Code. The proceeds of the Lease used to reimburse the Board for Project costs, or funds corresponding to such amounts, will not be used in a manner that results in the creation of "replacement proceeds", including "sinking funds", "pledged funds" or funds subject to a "negative pledge" (as such terms are defined in Treasury Regulations §1.148-1), of the Lease or another issue of debt obligations of the Board, other than amounts deposited into a "bona fide debt service fund" (as defined in Treasury Regulations §1.148-1). reimbursement allocations will occur not later than 18 months after the later of (i) the date the expenditure from a source other than the Lease is paid, or (ii) the date the Project is "placed in service" (within the meaning of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2) or abandoned, but in no event more than 3 years after the expenditure is paid.

Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### F. Other

1. It was moved by Verna, seconded by Governale and approved by unanimous voice vote of those present to adopt the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Demarest Board of Education will convene in a closed Executive Session on Tuesday, March 9, 2021 and March 16, 2021, if necessary, to discuss personnel, student and/or legal matters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the nature of the discussion is expected to be disclosed to the public at a future date.
